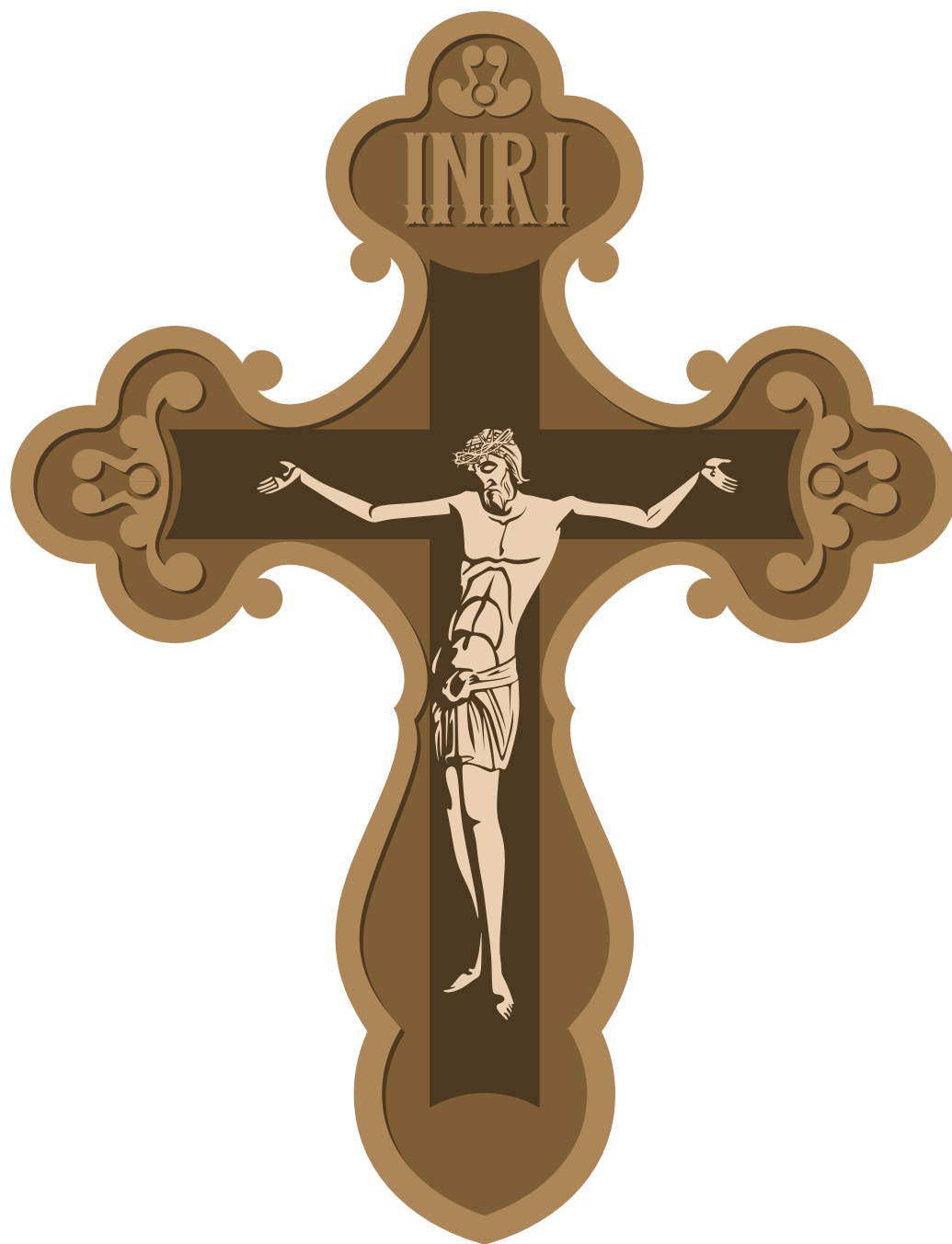
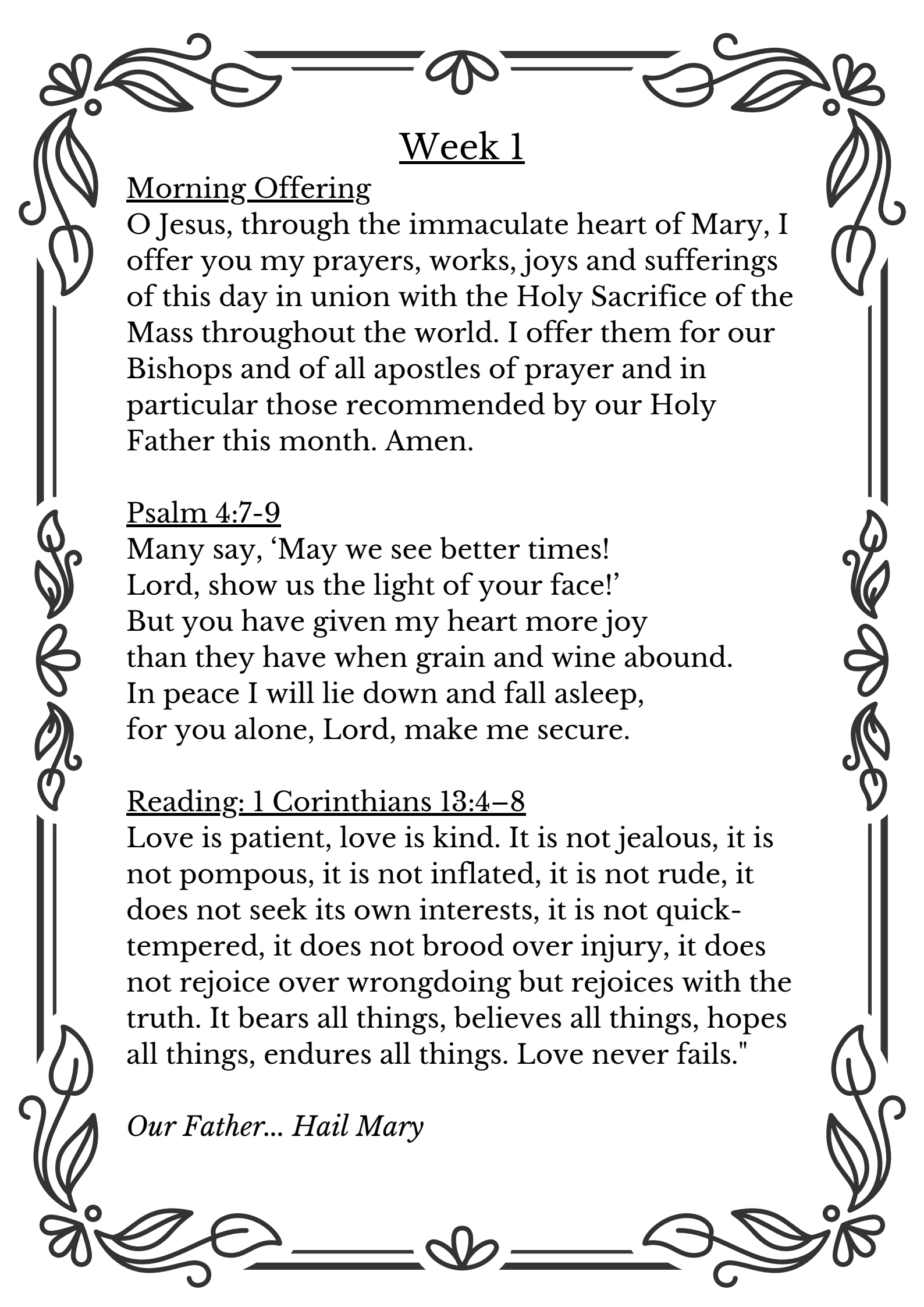

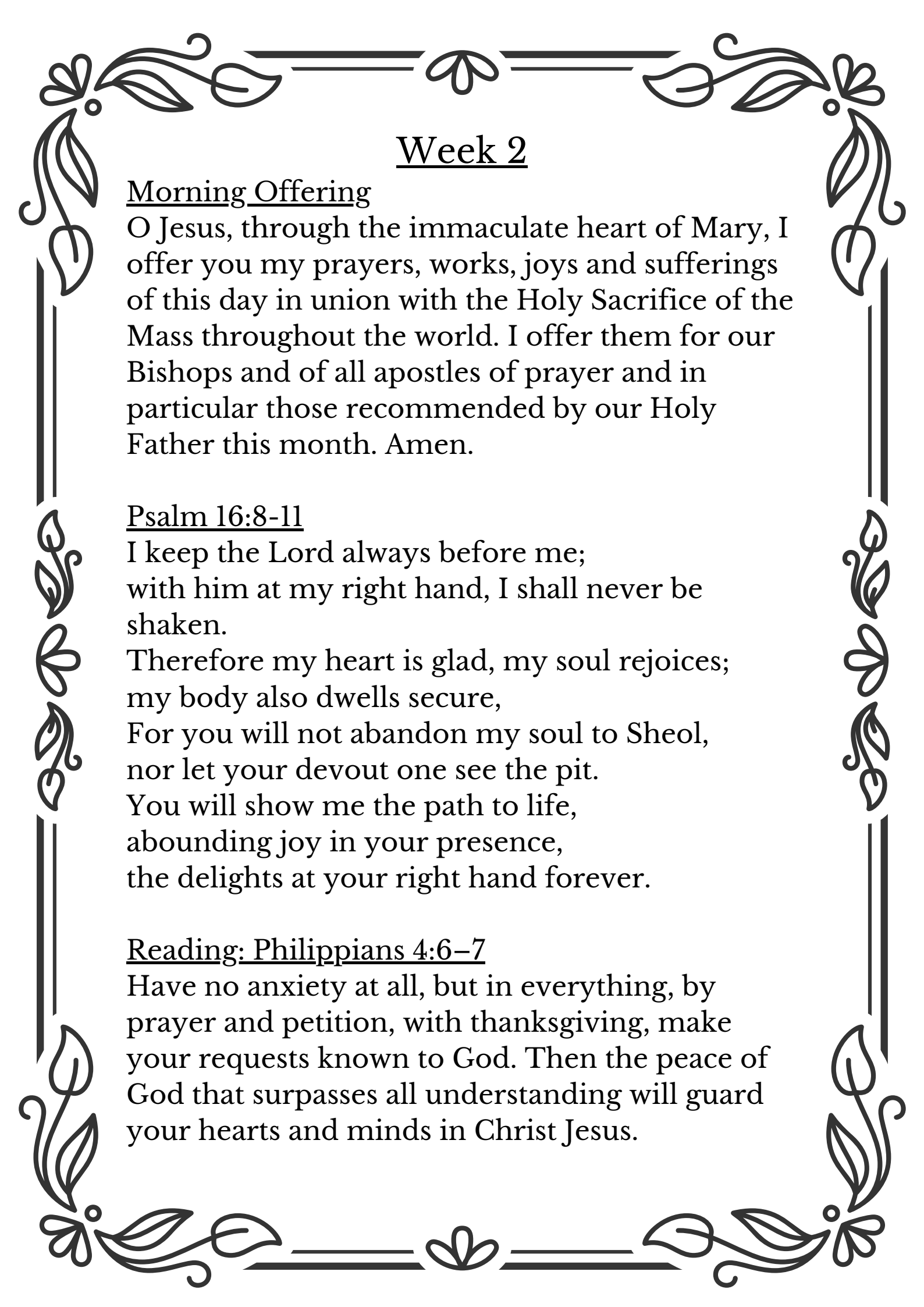

with him at my right hand, I shall never be shaken.

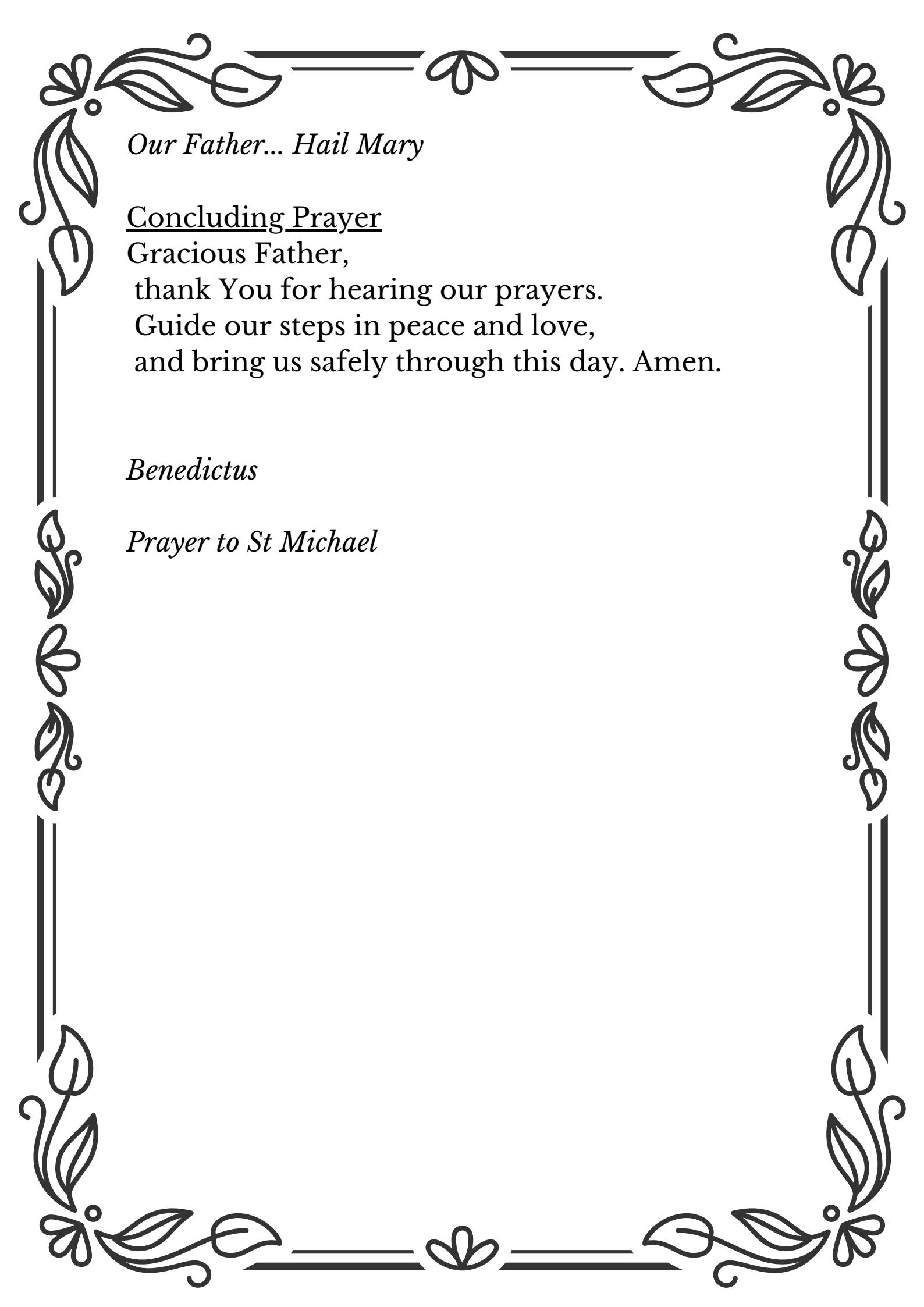
Therefore my heart is glad, my soul rejoices;

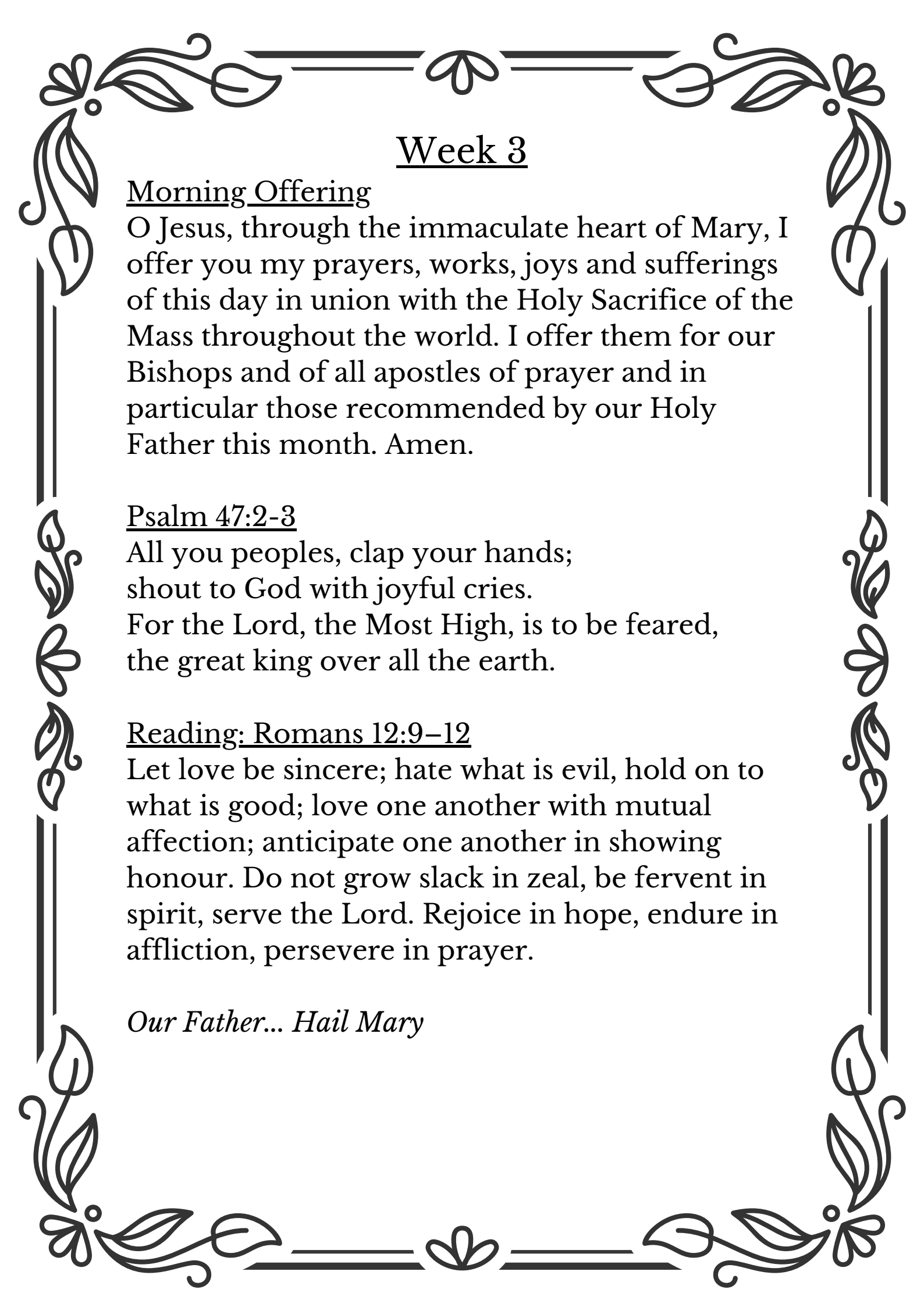

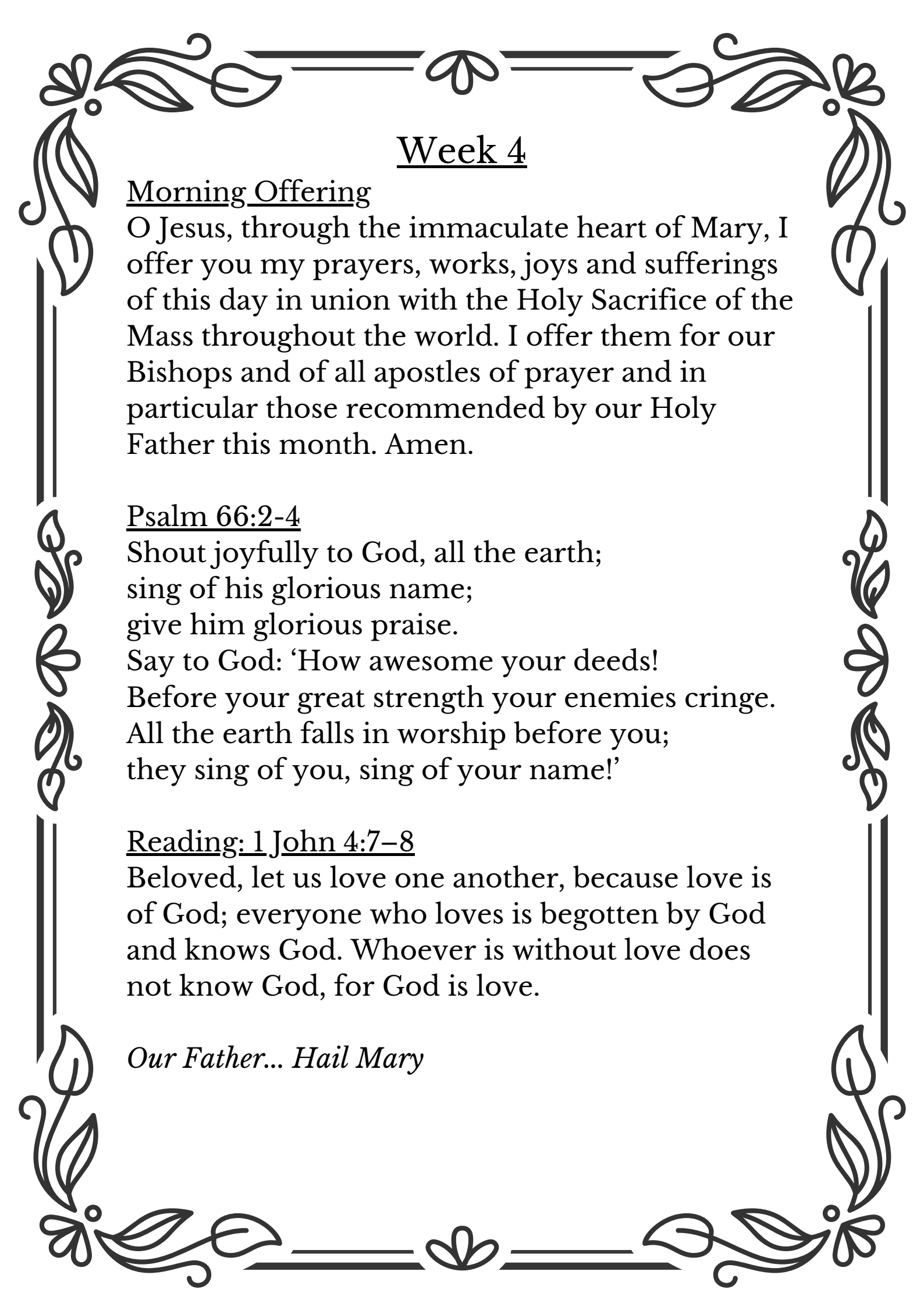

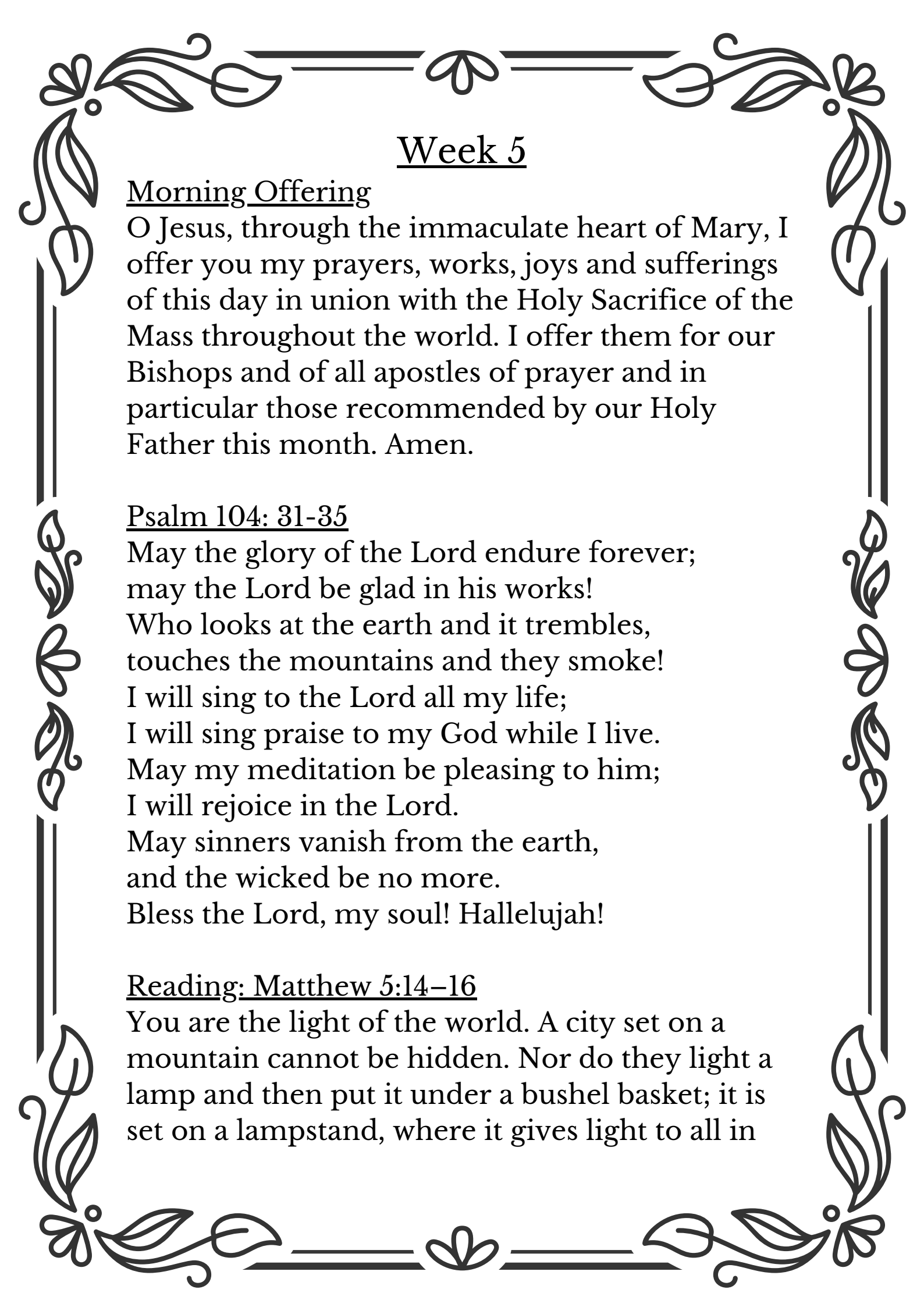

May my meditation be pleasing to him;

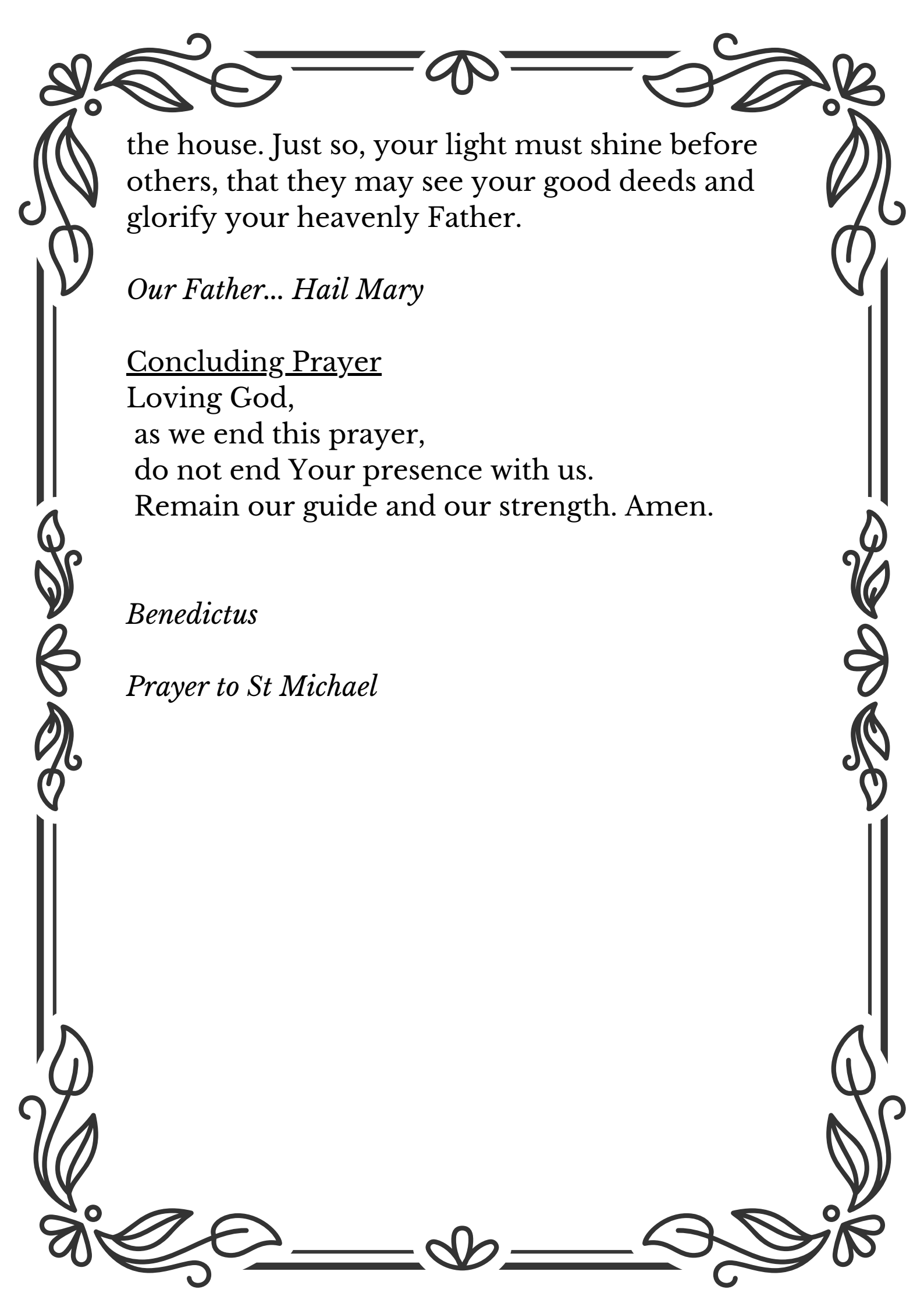
I will rejoice in the Lord.

the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.

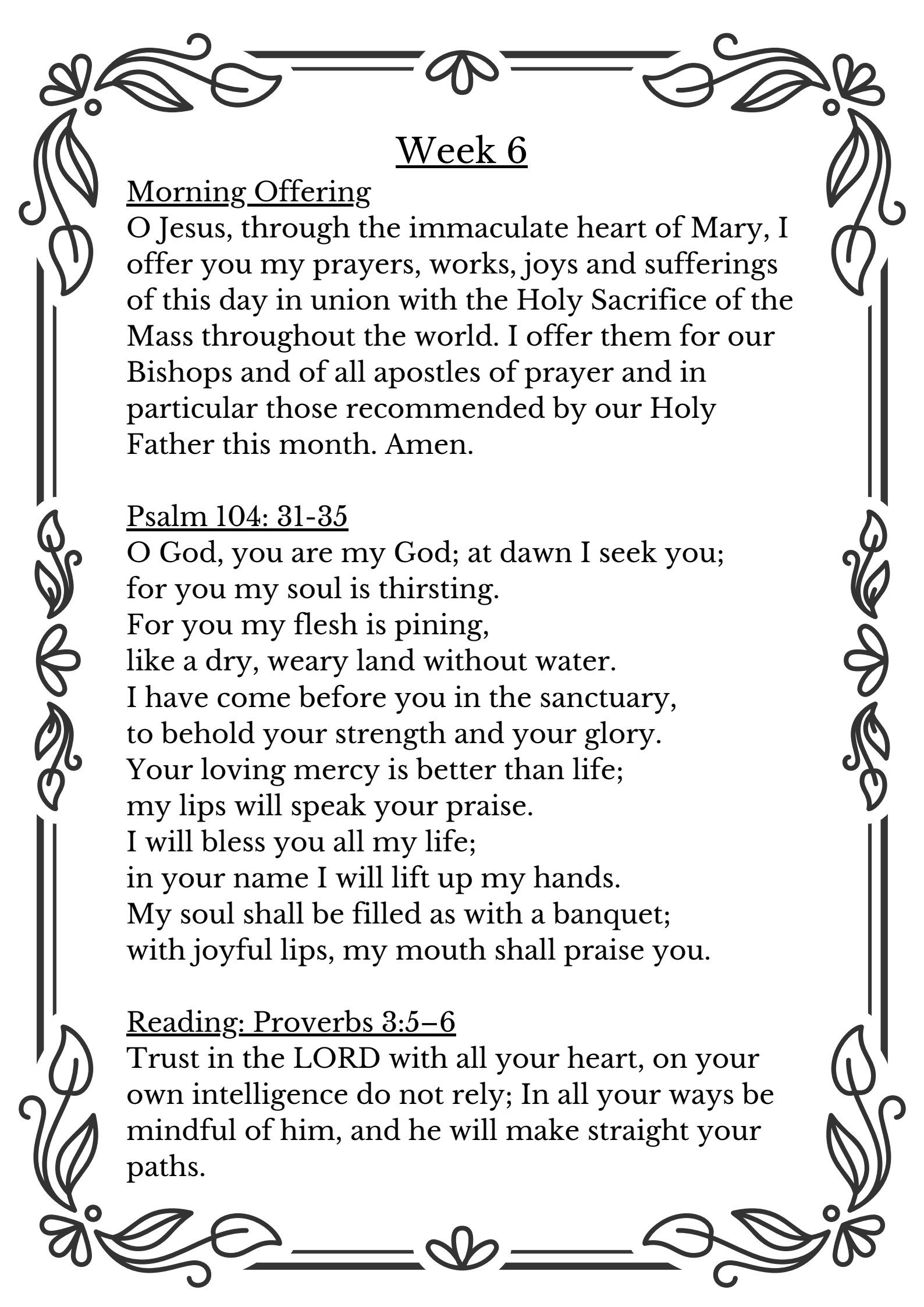

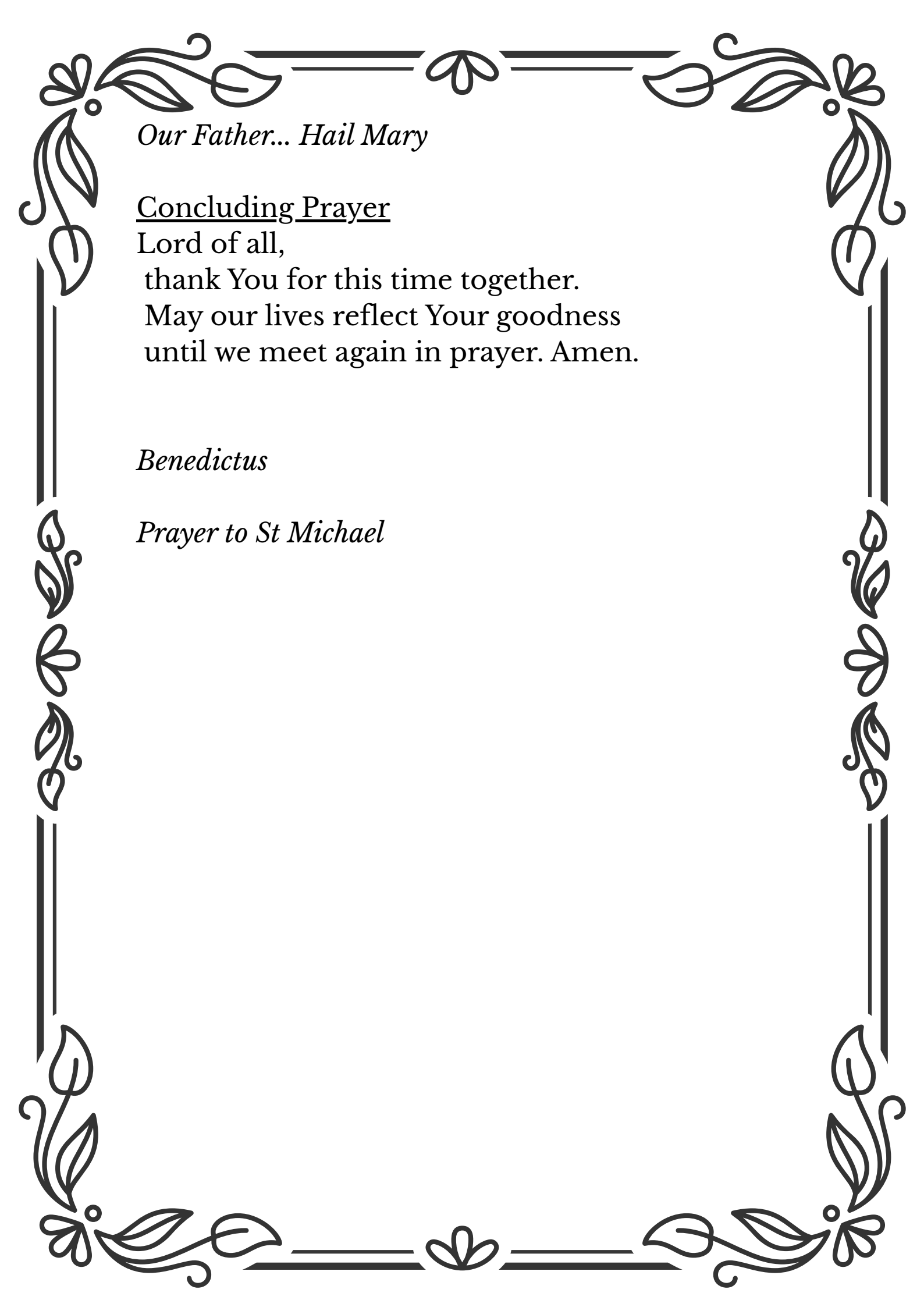

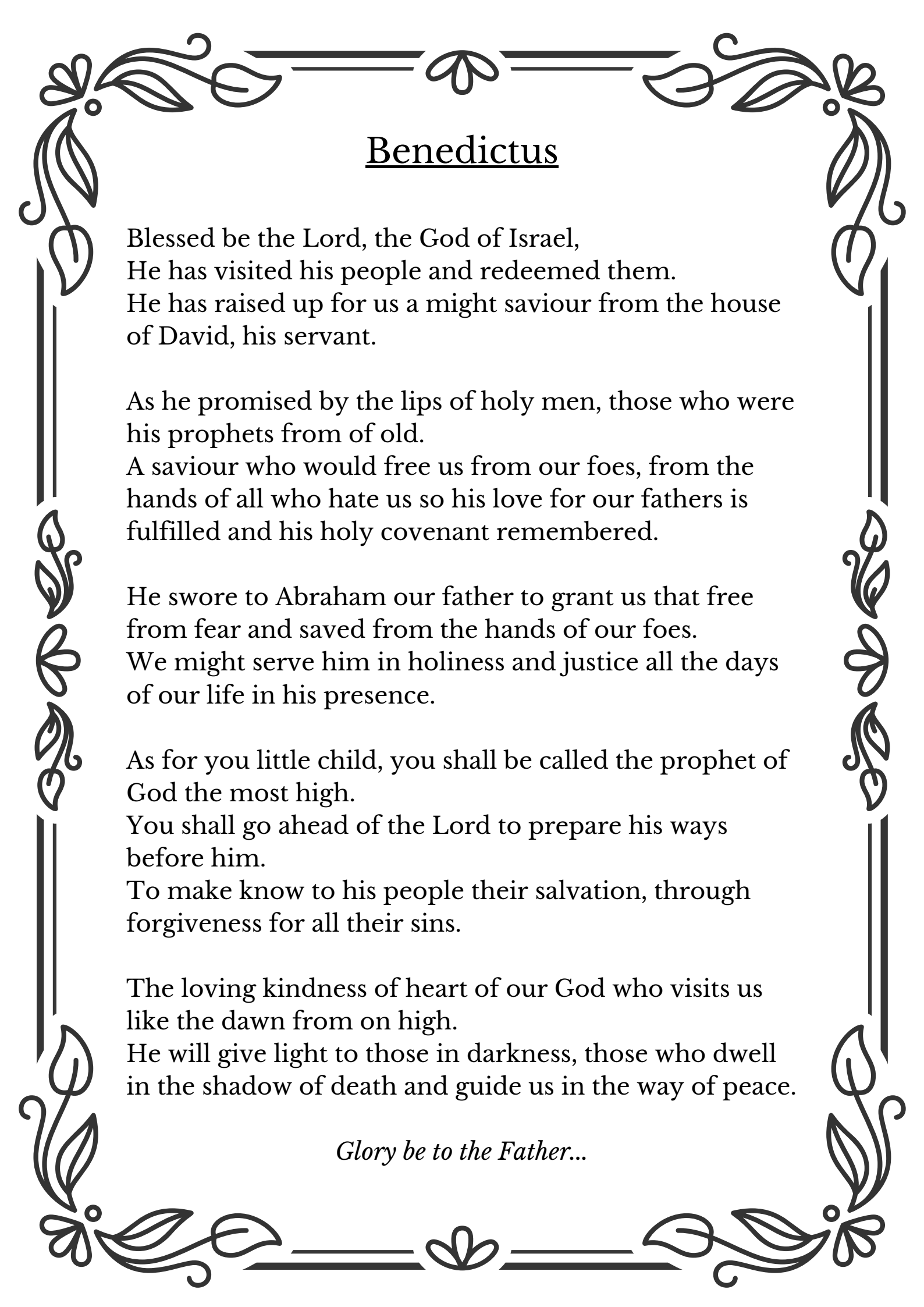

God the most high.

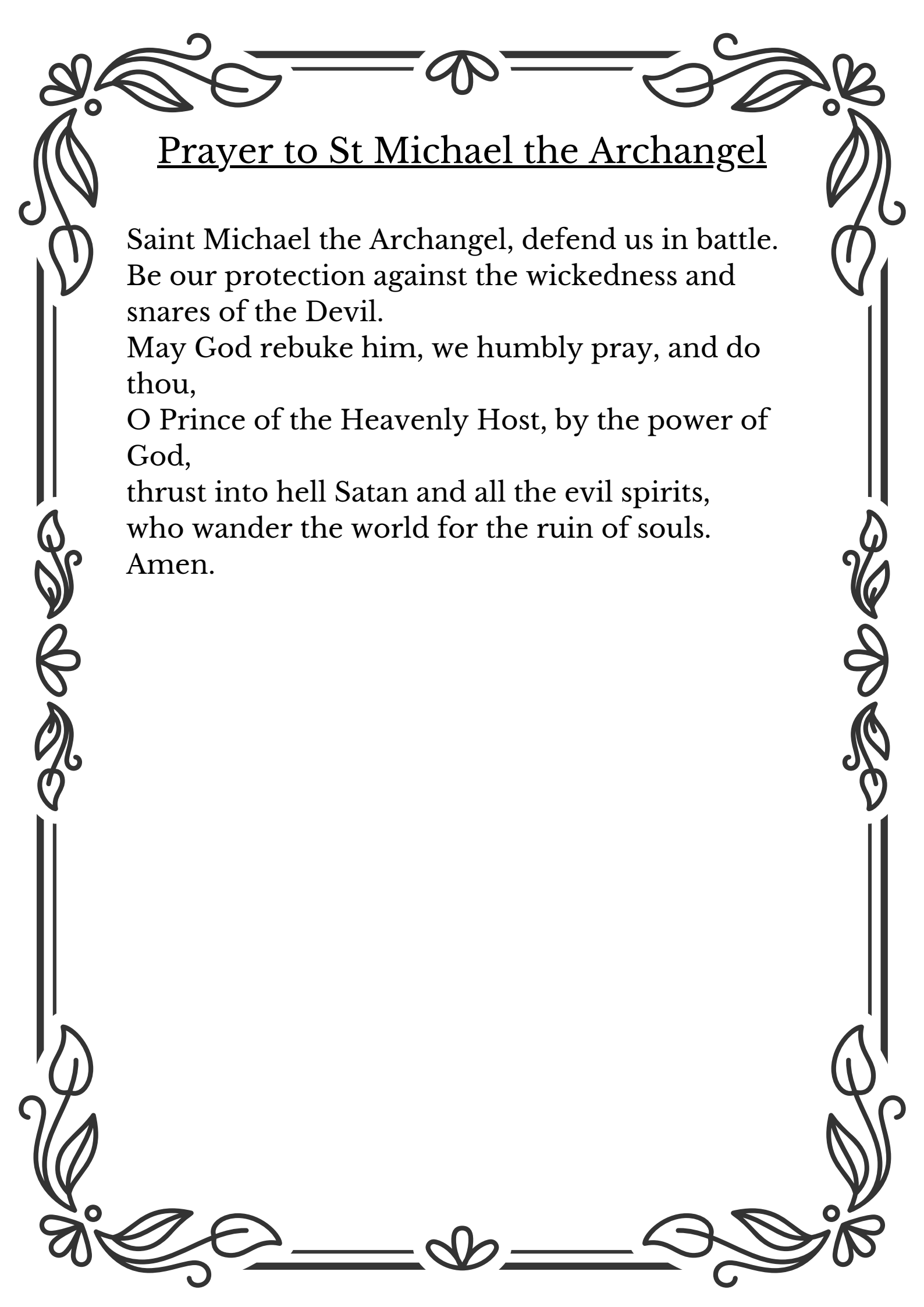
You shall go ahead of the Lord to prepare his ways
