## Dear Parents / Carers

All schools have a responsibility to ensure the regular upkeep and maintenance of their premises. These are an essential part of estate management. Maintaining buildings will help to ensure the safety of pupils using the premises, as well as present an effective learning environment, enhance the look of buildings making them an attractive place to work and learn.

As a church school, we enjoy the great privilege of being able to educate and nurture our children in our faith. We are free to teach Catholic Religious Education, to worship in an expressively Catholic way and to pass on Catholic and moral social teaching.

We are different from Community schools in that we do not receive all our funding from the Government. Like other Voluntary Aided schools, whether they are Church of England, Sikh, Jewish or Muslim, we only receive 90% of the money needed to run the school. Like these other schools, we ask our parents for voluntary contributions to make up the shortfall.

The Governing Body is responsible for the maintenance and improvement of the school premises. In order for any work to proceed, Governors (on your behalf) must fund 10% of the cost of any works. The school has a rolling programme of repairs and refurbishment.

During the last academic year, we:

- Laid new flooring in communal areas
- Continued to upgrade classroom computers and whiteboards
- Continued to replenish reading books schemes for the school libraries and class reading areas
- Purchased new resources for the Read, Write, Inc. Scheme
- Installed a wall art in KS1 Library and group intervention area
- Upgraded intervention areas throughout the school
- Replaced fencing along the school playing field

This year we hope to replace more classroom tables and chairs, re-carpet classrooms (where needed), continue with our ongoing improvement and upgrade to ICT equipment, create further inspired learning areas and as ever to continue to replace and improve our reading resources throughout the school. None of this is cheap! School budgets continue to come under increased pressure and we are politely asking more than ever that you pay this year's contribution promptly via ParentPay as soon as you can.
