Creation and Covenant

Children should be able to show understanding of the literary forms found in the Bible texts studied, including the use of metaphor, symbolic language, and poetry. They will be able to simply explain the Church's teaching on the purpose of the second Creation story and the purpose of scientific accounts, referencing Laudato Si', and making links with the term 'stewardship'.

They will also reflect on the ways in which the discoveries of science can lead to a deeper appreciation of the greatness of God and God's love for all Creation. Children should also be able to use theological vocabulary to describe and explain the belief that sin damages the relationship with God, the relationship with others and relationships with the created world, making relevant links with the second account of Creation and Laudato Si'.
